Project Based Learning


Project Based Learning (PBL) is a teaching approach which allows students to be engaged in sustained inquiry processes which result in deep understanding. Typically this involves solving a design or investigation problem over a sustained number of weeks. The subject matter is often embedded in the real world and because of this students are highly motivated to think deeper and harder to find resolution. Students work together on some or all aspects and rely on peer feedback against agreed criteria to improve their understanding. PBL is not discovery learning as students are given clear criteria and explicit teaching of the basic elements they require to build their deep understanding. It is their job to use that understanding, criteria and cycles of feedback and reflection to solve the problem. This type of learning is highly valued at RLPS because it places students in a position to develop high order skills which serve them well in situations to which they have not been specifically prepared for. Creativity, collaboration and the exercising of abstract thought processes to make new and important connections are other important aspects of PBL. Students who complete PBL experiences often talk about the voice and ownership that comes with these learning sequences. The graphics below explain the teaching practices and design elements which are essential to effective PBL. To support strong PBL implementation our teachers will be led by Mr Brittain and Ms Tang. Both teachers have a passion for PBL and are trained in best practice around PBL.

Lock Down Drill

This week we conducted a lock down drill. This involves an alarm being triggered and lock down procedures being activated. During a lock down all students and staff are locked inside to prevent a potential intruder from entering. Blinds are pulled down and staff make contact with office staff if needed. During the drill teachers provided students with advice about the drill and the need to follow procedures. Doing drills like this assists RLPS to improve our response to potential emergency situations and keeps everyone safe.











Student Leadership

We love seeing the passion students have for a cause become something powerful through their leadership. Last week we witnessed Ava and Luca work hard to raise awareness and money for The Children's Hospital. Ava has a sick brother Max who is receiving treatment and with Lucas she took it upon herself to support in the best way she could. They created an Art Club which raised enough money (\$148) to purchase some lovely books which they will donate to the hospital. We are very grateful to the Hill Of Content Bookshop in Balmain for providing a 25% discount on the books, allowing more books to be purchased.

Updated information for parents and carers about COVID-19 formerly referred to as Novel Coronavirus (Novel Coronavirus) 6 March 2020

Dear parent or caregiver,

The NSW Department of Education is working closely with the NSW Ministry of Health in response to the unfolding international COVID-19 (formerly referred to as Novel Coronavirus) situation.

Further travel restrictions

Effective of 5 March 2020, the Federal Government has issued updated advice on travel restrictions on foreign nationals (excluding permanent residents of Australia) coming to Australia from the Republic of Korea (South Korea).

Current advice from the NSW Government for parents and affected staff is:

- Any student or staff member who has left, or transited through mainland China since 1 February, Iran since 1 March or the Republic of Korea (South Korea) since 5 March, is excluded from child care services, school or work for 14 days from the date they left mainland China, Iran or the Republic of Korea (South Korea).
- Any confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded until they are medically cleared to return.
- Close contacts of a confirmed case of COVID-19 will be excluded for 14 days since last contact with the confirmed case.

Students and staff who have returned to Australia and have shown no symptoms during the 14-day self-isolation period are able to return to child care services, school or work.

The NSW Ministry of Health has processes to identify any close contacts of cases confirmed in Australia. Advice about not attending school would be provided to these close contacts by the NSW Ministry of Health.

Consistent with current guidelines, students who are unwell with respiratory illness should remain at home until symptoms resolve. In accordance with the NSW Department of Education's current practice, if any student becomes unwell, the school will implement infection control guidelines and follow the advice provided by the NSW Ministry of Health as appropriate.

Maintaining good hygiene standards is an important way to reduce the risk of acquiring and spreading respiratory infections. Parents and caregivers are asked to promote good hygiene, including handwashing with soap as <u>handwashing</u> is the single most effective way to reduce the spread of germs that cause respiratory disease.

The NSW Ministry of Health has advice and resources about COVID-19 in English. Chinese and other languages

The NSW Department of Education will continue monitoring the COVID-19 situation and provide parents and caregivers with updated information about the virus.

Excursion Uniform
