### **COVID-19 Update**

### **Student Attendance Arrangements**

As previously advised all students are expected to return to school one day per week from next week. Although no dates have been confirmed it is expected the days students attend will increase as COVID-19 infection rates decline. Students will attend in class groups one day per week according to the schedule below:

The above arrangements allow teachers to effectively connect with their own students to support wellbeing, conduct assessments and maximise learning outcomes. Without designated class days it is likely students would not have opportunities to connect with their classmates or receive direct interactive learning with their own teacher. We understand the above arrangements will not suit all families and students, however note that the school remains open every day for any student who needs to attend. If you have several children attending the school you may choose to send them more than one day to gain consistency in your family while ensuring each child attends on the day they have been designated.

To ensure appropriate physical distancing from Week 3 onwards parents are required to drop/collect their children at the entrances/exits designated below from 9am and 3.25pm respectively. Children from the same family are permitted to use the entrance/exit for the youngest child in the family. Staff will supervise each gate to receive and release your child to you. Please do not enter the school unless you have a need to meet with school staff.

#### **Student Reports**

Assessment and reporting on student progress in 2020 has been difficult and as a result it is unclear whether student reports will be provided in Semester 1 or whether a modified report will be provided. Decisions on school reporting are made at a federal level in discussion with the states and territories and not at a school level. When a decision is made we will advise parents and prepare student reports in accordance with the decision.

### **School Cleaning**

Additional cleaning has been undertaken each to sanitise high traffic areas of the school. This enhanced cleaning will be added to in Week 3 in response to the increased numbers of students who will be attending. The school has good supplies of hand sanitiser and students will be instructed to clean their hands throughout the day.

#### **Online SRE and SEE**

Online resources have been made available to school and students who wish to continue ethics and religious education at home. The five live portal entry points to lesson content are provided below:

Please note these are optional learning activities for those students who wish to remain involved in SEE and SRE learning.


### **Improving Home Learning**

Although home learning may be phased out in the next few weeks we have reviewed the success of the current arrangements through analysis of the parent home learning survey. A review of this data and the experiences of teachers has given RLPS importance information about future delivery.

In summary improvements could include:


- Parent workshops on engagement/motivation, school expectations, time management, giving feedback, use of online applications, how to use the task criteria, specific syllabus areas and maintaining wellbeing.
- Stage level feedback to parents on task completion and general student progress/improvement areas.
- Recommended duration for home learning tasks.
- More teacher instructional videos.
- Zoom sessions for parents.
- More extra-curricular activities.
- Clearer expectations on how to complete tasks.

Teachers have commenced implementing relevant aspects of the above including more instructional videos. The Zoom meetings will continue to provide a wellbeing check in and generalised advice to students about the learning they are encountering. Teachers will provide direct feedback to students during school hours however they may not respond directly to every comment or upload everyday. Expectations for hours spent engaged in home learning are listed on the following page. Please note this is a guide and not all students will be engaged in learning to this level. The parent workshops described above will be delivered if the current home learning pattern is maintained or if it is reengaged at a later date.
