School Improvement Plan

This year our school will commence another school improvement cycle. Our improvement will be guided by a new school plan which will be published at the end of the Term. The focus of this plan is student achievement through improved data evaluation and teaching and learning strategies. These improvements will be supported by improved leadership capability and parent engagement around evidence based practice.

The new plan has been drafted to reflect the implications of the Situational Analysis completed in term 4 last year and the expectations of the School Excellence Framework. These documents explain best practice for all schools and what our data is telling us about our local context. We are also guided by another key document published by the Department of Education: What works best. This document describes the strategies and practices which the Department of Education has identified as having the biggest impact on student learning. You can access a summary paper here:

Throughout the improvement cycle we will communicate our progress to the school community and the implications for future development. The plan will be published on our school web page.



Character Strengths

At RLPS we use a positive psychology approach with students. Ms Abdulkhalek and Mrs Stewart-Slaats introduced our school to these ideas in 2019 and since that time we have been helping students to understand and focus the strengths which will give them the most opportunity to succeed. The approach is based on internationally recognized research by Martin Seligman who describes positive psychology as "the scientific study of human strengths and virtues." His work identified 24 distinct character strengths which are common across cultures, age groups and genders. Our students are familiar with these strengths and all learning spaces have visual displays of each strength. The concrete columns which hold each floor of our school up are also covered with visuals of each character strength. These columns display the attributes of each character strength and socially as well as physically hold our school community together.

As students grow and become familiar with character strengths they learn to identify and develop their unique talents. When you exercise your strengths on a regular basis you do well and this brings positive emotion and belief in oneself. Students with well developed understanding of their strengths are more resilient and are able to maintain positive relationships with others. Students at RLPS also recognise that everyone has different but worthy strengths. This allows all students to feel valued and work hard to be their best self.

Early Stage 1 has been working in class and during Library time on the character strengths of Kindness and Self-regulation (self-control). Quality literature is used to help bring each strength to life. Students learn the behaviors that are associated with each strength as the characters in each book interact and the story unfolds. This term enhanced understanding of kindness and self-regulation throughreading has ultimately helped students to be more successful with friendships and in their management of conflict or negative emotions. One of the books featured is "Have You Filled A Bucket Today?" This book encourages positive relationships as students learn how nice it feels to fill someone's emotional bucket. When they express kindness, appreciation and love on a daily basis they feel good too. Our students know that behaviours such as sharing, smiling, loving, helping, complimenting and respecting can "fill" someone's bucket.
