


#### **Earthquake Measuring**

When adults look back at the learning they did at primary school certain moments often stand out. If you think back to your own primary school experiences what stands out for you? Which learning moments had the biggest and most positive impact? If you are like most people it is the student led, high engagement, hands-on learning that comes to mind. We get high impact learning when students get to actively engage with ideas, problem solve and physically test them during hands-on activities. As well as explicit instruction about earthquakes, students in Stage 3 have been given the opportunity to simulate seismic activity and measure the same using an improvised seismograph. Working in teams they created readings which measured the movement of the classroom desk. It would have been easy to simply show a video of a seismograph or even demonstrate the same but we want students to be engaged and build durable understanding. Learning like this is a feature of every RLPS classroom and we know as adults our students will have powerful memories to draw upon.
