








Writing In Kindergarten

Celebrating Growth





Procedures for student use of mobile phones

It is not necessary for most students to bring a phone to school. Children are often exposed to many hours of screen time each day and school provides an important opportunity for students to have periods of downtime from screen devices. Direct parent communication with students during the school day is only required in emergency situations. In these instances contact can be made in the usual way by contacting the school office.

Purpose of this procedure

- To provide clear guidelines for students and parents regarding the use and possession of mobile phones at RLPS.
- To ensure the privacy and safety of all students is not compromised.
- To ensure learning time is not adversely affected by mobile phone use.

Guidelines

- Students who bring a phone to school must not access it during school hours unless instructed to by their teacher to support learning activities.
- Students must keep their phones switched off and in their school bags throughout the school day.
- Students are not permitted to use their phone to film, record or communicate with others unless this is specifically requested as part of class learning activities.
- Students must not lend their phone to others and are responsible for how it is used within the school.
- Students bring mobile phones to school at their own risk. The school and school staff members will not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to mobile phones or for investigating loss or damage.

Specific Guidelines for phone use during excursions

- Mobile phones can be taken on excursions only if the excursion permission note indicates phones are permitted.
- For most excursions only devices owned by the school will be used by students. This ensures students have equal access to technology and are protected from devices that have unrestricted network coverage.
- Any mobile phones that are used on excursions will be used in a way that do not breach the guidelines described above.
- Phones may be used to record events on the excursion, however, students are not permitted to take
 photographs of other students without their permission. At no time are photographs taken of other
 students permitted to be uploaded onto the internet, including social media applications and websites.
 These photographs are for personal record and memories of the excursion only.
- During the excursion, students will not be permitted to communicate with their peers and/or with other friends or family members using their phone. Any communication needed will be through the excursion coordinator via the school office.

These procedures apply equally to the use of all other portable computer games, iPads, iPods and similar devices.

Please be reminded of our mobile and smart watch policy. Students using these devices at school will be asked to leave them at home.


it's very fun for the podcasters and we hope it's fun for everyone else.

THE LEGACY THAT LESLEY LEFT

Today I met Dan Spangler, Principal of Russell Lea Public School and we discussed Lesley's career. In 2017, Lesley Pike retired from Russell Lea Public School after 41 years in the job becoming the state's longest serving principal at one school, almost half if the schools 90 years.. She taught up to three generations of students, many who have graduated into careers where they make the world a better place and improve the lives of others. "This has not been a job, it's a way of life" she said. What I didn't know is that Dawn Pugh painted a portrait of Lesley which was entered in the 2017 Archibald. Before retiring though Lesley completed the rebuilding of the school which now includes the 'Lesley Pike' Library. Our Jim Simpson has had a long association with Lesley.







