# **Curriculum & Instruction**

## Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

Phonics is the main way in which children at Russell Lea Public School are taught to read in their earliest years. It is a method for learning reading and spelling through the decoding of the alphabetic language. Phonics, taught in a structured way, is the most effective way to teach reading and spelling. At RLPS, learners are taught reading and spelling, using an explicit, systematic phonics lesson, daily throughout the week. Each session follows a structured and progressive format. These take the form of explicit teacher led sessions that are complimented with individual practice using books, games and activities. Teachers assess student understanding throughout each session and routinely assess knowledge of graphemes and the application of this knowledge in reading and spelling, to see whether the learner is ready to move on to the next phase of their learning.

Over the last few years, K-2 teachers have undertaken a considerable amount of professional development to improve their understanding of phonics and their capacity to enhance student outcomes through their teaching and assessing. As a result of this, RLPS has once again achieved results that are significantly higher than the expected state average (usually around 55%) in the mandated Year 1 Phonics Screening Check, and results that have once again improved upon our own personal best. Well done Year 1 students. May you all enjoy the lifetime of reading ahead of you.

# **HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME?**

- Practise segmenting and blending
- Encourage decoding of unfamiliar words when reading
- Support your child to complete their phonics homework
- Practise new sounds and graphemes
- Practice reading and spelling High Frequency Words
- Use Decodable Readers to explicitly practice application of phonics knowledge
- Read to and with your child everyday





# The Lab Guide for Parents



**The Lab Network** (<u>https://thelab.org.au/</u>) is a group of not-for-profit technology clubs for young people on the autism spectrum. They provide a welcoming space where participants can explore their own technology interests at their own pace in a safe social environment, with help from mentors. The Lab aims to support participants to develop important skills, gain confidence, and pursue their passions. While The Lab is not NDIS registered, many Lab participants use their NDIS plans to pay for Lab sessions.

# What We Do in Lab sessions

At each weekly two-hour Lab session, two technology professionals work individually with between 10 and 15 young people to develop their social and technology skills. Participants can share their interests in a wide variety of activities such as gaming together, video creation, graphic design, coding and game development. Mentors are available during Lab sessions to support activities or to work with participants on new projects of interest to them. We've found that some of the most useful things first learned by participants during Lab sessions are social and personal skills. The Lab is about technology skills too, but typically the coding and design skills come a little later once participants have settled in. This can take a little time and one of the essential aspects of The Lab is that kids find their own place and in their own time. At most Labs, participants will need to bring their own laptops or devices.

## **Our Approach to Lab Sessions**

The Lab takes an unstructured approach so every session can be different. Participants undertake activities because it interests them, not because they have to. These interests drive the direction and type of activities; like learning a particular IT programs, or just mixing with others who share similar interests in games. The Lab is designed to be a cool and accepting place to visit, hang out and learn while having fun. This approach is deliberately unlike a classroom and is based on the experience with thousands of young people. Hence, there is no expectation of specific learning outcomes or guarantees of participants' engagement. The Lab may not suit everyone, with the best gauge of engagement is whether or not the participant is keen to continue. We have found that much informal learning occurs within platforms such as computer games – but this is not always obvious to others. If you are not sure what your child is doing when they use technology, or you have any concerns, please ask the mentors.

### The Role of the Mentor

The mentor's role is to support participants technology and skill development experience during Lab sessions and to foster a fun and positive environment. Mentors are there to assist young people to share their interests, to develop new skills and to have fun whenever possible. Mentors have a wide range of experience with video games, games development, coding or digital media in a variety of areas. Lab mentors are computer programmers or designers with mentoring skills. They are committed, caring people, often with personal experience of autism and considerable computing experience. You'll find few behavioural issues in a Lab session and mentors are not expected to be teachers, disciplinarians or therapists. The Lab provides technical computer mentoring and support only.

# The Lab Five Dock

The Lab Five Dock is specifically catered for ages 10–13 years to help build foundational skills, with mentors supporting participants in gaming, coding and 3D printing. We offer a welcoming atmosphere for social development, alongside a vibrant mix of technology and fun! All sessions are run at Five Dock Library on Monday afternoons from 3:30pm to 5:30pm for 9-weeks during school terms. Parents are required to stay in the library space where there are workspaces and free WiFi.

- As these participants are younger, there are sign-in and out sheets for every session.
- We ask all parents and carers to stay in Five Dock Library for behavioural management and safety purposes, and also request their contact number, in case they are needed urgently.
- Written permission must be delivered to a mentor or Lab organiser, prior to the end of session, that the child will leave unaccompanied.
- Parents and carers are to inform The Lab about any medications, allergies, behavioural issues or additional needs that may need to be considered or managed, which is completed when purchasing tickets for our documentation.
- Timers, visual displays, and verbal reminders will be demonstrated to set routine and structure.
- Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) is required for The Lab Five Dock.

## The Lab Rhodes

The Lab Rhodes is designed for ages 13–16 years with a focus on technical and creative skills, supported by professionals in coding, digital design, gaming, 3D printing and more. We offer a welcoming space to encourage social growth in a secure and supportive environment. All sessions are run at The Learning Space, Rhodes on Thursday afternoons from 3:30pm to 5:30pm during school term. Parents and carers are welcomed to stay in the library space where there are workspaces and free WiFi.

- As these participants are older, there are no sign-in and out sheets.
- We ask all parents and carers to be nearby and request their contact number, in case they are needed urgently.
- For new families, parents and carers are requested to stay at The Learning Space during your child's session for behavioural management and safety purposes, for at least one term.
- Parents and carers are given the option, when purchasing tickets, to allow their child to arrive and leave the venue without their supervision. This is considered written permission to The Lab.
- Parents and carers are to inform The Lab about any medications, allergies, behavioural issues or additional needs that may need to be considered or managed, which is requested when purchasing tickets for our documentation.
